The former head of LatinAmerican operations for the
Central Intelligence Agency
wrote the widow of President
Salvador Allende Gossens of
Chile denying that the C.I.A.
was in any way responsible for
the Marxist leader's overthrow
and death in 1973.

David A. Philipps, who retired from the agency May 9
after 24 years, wrote Hortensia
Bussi de Allende the next day:

"You have been led to believe that evidence exists which
makes the C.I.A. accountable
for the circumstances which
brought your husband to his
untimely end. Because I supervised that component of C.I.A.
concerned with Chile and its
neighbors, the accusation bothers me personnal. The claim, I
assure you, is untrue and the
evidence tainted."
