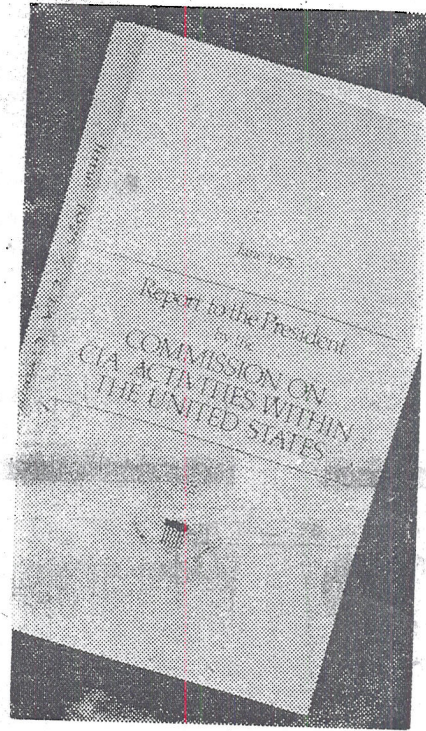


Highlights Of Findings By Panel

Here are the highlights of the Rockefeller Commission report in which the Central Intelligence Agency was accused of engaging in scores of "plainly unlawful and . . . improper invasions" of constitutional rights:

- Under Operation CHAOS, the CIA unlawfully engaged in spying on thousands of Americans.
- The CIA hid from postal officials for nearly 20 years the fact they were opening thousands of letters.
- The Justice Department allowed the CIA to decide whether to prosecute criminal charges involving agency members.
- No link was found between the CIA and the assassination of President Kennedy in 1963.
- Richard Helms and other CIA officials directed domestic intelligence programs they knew to be illegal.
