## COURT BARS A MOVE TO SEIZE C.I.A. FILES A motion to compel the Cen-tral Intelligence Agency to turn over all its files on Grove Press to a court for safekeeping was rejected yesterday by Judge Kevin Thomas Duffy in Federal District Court in Manhattan. Lawyers for Grove Press and

its president, Barnet Rosset, made the motion last month in their lawsuit seeking more than

their lawsuit seeking more than \$10-million in damages from the C.I.A. for aleged wiretap-ping and other illegal activities against the publishing house. Grove Press had complained in its motion that the C.I.A. might destroy or alter the dis-puted documents in its files un-less the material was delivered to the Federal District Court, but the general counsel of the C.I.A. submitted a sworn state-ment pledging that none of the material would be destroyed or altered. Judge Duffy ruled that Grove

altered. Judge Duffy ruled that Grove Press, had not met the require-ments for a preliminary injunc-tion, and that there was no reason to doubt the Govern-ment's counsel's promise that all the documents would be preserved pending the outcome of the suit.
