LOS ANGELES—The Central Intelligence Agency has refused to produce in state court any information it may have about the 1975 burglary of Howard Hughes' headquarters here.

The information is being sought by Donald R. Woolbright who is charged with attempting to extort \$1 million from Hughes' Summa Corp. for the return of files, reportedly stolen on June 5, 1975, by four unknown safecrackers. Summa served as a front for the CIA in its partially successful effort to recover a sunken Russian submarine.

Assistant U.S. Attorney Dominick Rubalcava said the

Assistant U.S. Attorney Dominick Rubalcava said the CIA refused to hand over any information based on the argument that state courts do not have jurisdiction. He refused to say what the CIA's position would be in a federal court case.

An attorney for Woolbright said he will now go into federal court to get the information.
