## U.S. Official Said To Quit Sweden After Spy Charge

STOCKHOLM, March 4 (Reuters).—A U.S. diplomat, accused by an African journalist here of having tried to recruit him as a spy for the CIA in Angola, has left Sweden, the Foreign Ministry said today.

Bruce Hutchins, second secretary at the U.S. Embassy in Stockholm, left the country two days ago with his wife. On the same day a leftist magazine accused him of using veiled threats against relatives of Kenyan journalist Arthur Opot in an attempt to recruit him as a CIA agent.

In a 12-page article, the magazine Fib-Kulturfront said Mr. Opot, a freelance journalist at the Swedish Broadcasting Corp., had accepted money from Mr. Hutchins to travel twice to Angola and had fed him false information about the Sovietbacked Popular Movement for the Liberation of Angola and about Swedish journalists working in Angola.
