Admiral to Key Intelligence Post

CIA Director George Bush yesterday named a former commander of the Sixth Fleet to be his deputy for relations with other intelligence agencies and called the appointment an important step in reorganizing the intelligence community.

The former commander, Vice Admiral Daniel J. Murphy, "will direct the day-to-day business of the community staff and has particular responsibility for the management of resources devoted to U.S. intelligence activities," Bush said.

A CIA spokesman said Murphy, 54, will be Bush's second deputy under President Ford's executive order to reorganize U.S. intelligence agencies. The other is Army Lieutenant General Vernon A. Walters, who has been deputy CIA director for several years.
