C.A. Data Intact 6 Months
WASHINGTON, June 10
(UPI)— The Senate Intelligence Committee has proposed a six-month moratorium on the destruction of certain Central Intelligence Agency records and documents, the committee chairman Daniel K. Inouye, Democrat of Hawaii, said today.

In a letter to the Senate Democratic leader, Mike Mansfield, Mr. Inouye said the committee had unanimously agreed that the records and documents ordered preserved for the C.I.A. investigations should be kept intact for another half year.

Mr. Inouye said that the committee had also agreed "that notice should be given of the moratorium of destruction so that those who may wish to take legal action may do so."

He said that the committee had also recommended that the C.I.A. and other intelligence agencies submit an inventory of records to be destroyed and that the committee staff review those documents.
