Final 'Proof' On Oswald By This Fall

The head of the House subcommittee on the assassination of President Kennedy says his panel should be able to prove this fall whether Lee Harvey Oswald acted alone or as part of a conspiracy in Kennedy's death.

"I think that from the physical, scientific and forensic evidence we will be able to demonstrate conclusively whether or not Oswald was the lone shooter at Dealey Plaza," Representative L. Richardson Preyer (Dem-N.C.) said in an interview yesterday in the Winston-Salem Journal.

"Of course, from the scientific evidence, you can't answer the question of whether he did have help in a conspiracy," Preyer added. "But I think we'll be able to answer that too — until all of the evidence is in, it's impossible to say. But I know we're going to answer a lot of questions and a lot of various theories."

Seeking the answers to one of those theories, Preyer slipped into Cuba earlier this year to try to learn if there was a Cuban connection in the assassination. He said he was still in touch with Cuban officials "exchanging information."
