

Upstate Congressman Favors Phone Tapping

ALBANY, April 16 (AP)—Representative Carlton J. King, Republican of Saratoga Springs, told an Albany Chamber of Commerce audience today that he would have no objection to having his telephone tapped and he criticized Hale Boggs of Louisiana, who is Democratic House leader, for speaking out against the Federal Bureau of Investigation.

Mr. King said Mr. Boggs's recent criticism of J. Edgar Hoover amounted to "one of the most outrageous statements a House leader could make."

He also said: "I think the tapping of phones is necessary for the defense of our country. I think it's high time some people were watched."
