
**Meany Says A.F.L.-C.I.O.
Seeks Wiretapping Curbs**

WASHINGTON, June 16 (AP) —George Meany, president of the A.F.L.-C.I.O., said Wednesday that the labor federation opposed Federal wiretapping of United States citizens in national security cases.

Mr. Meany said the Government should have the right to protect against Communist subversion, "but we flatly reject the notion that the way to fight Communism is to jettison individual liberties."

Mr. Meany told a forum on invasion of privacy sponsored by the American Federation of Labor and Congress of Industrial Organizations' Maritime Trades Department that the labor federation wanted legislation strictly limiting wiretapping to court-authorized cases involving espionage, treason and kidnapping.
