## Data Banks Suit Filed by ACLU

Attorneys for the American Civil Liberties Union here have filed what they call a "land-mark" suit to prevent "computer invasion of privacy." Marson said he will argue that such a data bank is an invasion of privacy "If we

Charles Marson, ACLU staff counsel, said the suit was filed Friday in Superior Court on behalf of social workers Josephine Belmont and Glenda Pawsey.

The two women were disciplined by the State Department of Social Welfare after they refused to disclose confidential information about welfare recipients for inclu-sion in a computer data bank, Marson said.

that such a data bank is an invasion of privacy. "If we win," he said, "there will be grounds to sue federal, state and local governments on the theory of invasion of privacy wherever they operate data banks without adequate safe-guards for privacy."

He said he expects the losing side to appeal, possibly all the way to the U.S. Su-preme Court.
