\*\*The short answer to this blunderbuss assertion is that the Supreme Court had held that some forms of wiretapping were constitutional when accompanied by appropriate safe companied by appropriate safe sured in this case.

In appealing their convictions ruled that it was constitutional.

The Court of Appeals for the Eighth Circuit upheld the legality of wiretapping in affirming the convictions of four men charged with possessing and transporting illegally imported heroin.

In the ruling issued Monday, and the three-judge appeals court panel said that the United States Supreme Court had held that some forms of wiretapping were constitutional when accompanied by appropriate safe sured in this case.

In appealing their convictions, the four men had contended that wiretapping was contrary to the First Amendment's protection from unreasonable search, the Fouth Amendment's lowing wiretapping was "unconstitutional on its face" because it violated the Fourth Amendment. His ruling came in approving a motion by seven defendants in a gambling case widence gathered by electronic surveillancee.
