Naval intelligence documents
released yesterday show the
agents kept several groups un-
der surveillance, including ci-
vilian protest groups that were
organized to, protest the Re-
publican National Convention.The spying was conducted
well after the Nixon Adminis-
traine it was moving to
muzzle civilian surveillance by
the military. The Navy de-
clined to comment about the
legality of its investigations of
civilian groups.
One report concluded that
antiwar Navy personnel were
not planning any violent activ-
ity. No instances of violence
by Naval antiwar activists were
