

Bill in Congress Would Give Stalin's Daughter Asylum

WASHINGTON, March 21 (AP)—Legislation that would grant United States asylum to Stalin's daughter, Svetlana Alliluyeva, was introduced today by Representative Paul Findley, Republican of Illinois.

Mr. Findley said he introduced the bill "as a first step towards restoring America's great tradition as a sanctuary for all those fleeing from tyranny."

He said the United States passed up "a great opportunity to reveal the bankruptcy of Communist life" by not granting asylum to her earlier.

"The United States appears to be so obsessed with placating the Soviet dictatorship," he said, "that it has turned away a woman seeking safety."
