Former Host To Svetlana Found Dead

The body of an elderly Long Island millionaire, who once played host to Josef Stalin's daughter, was found yesterday on a golf course.

Police said Stuart H. Johnson Sr., 75, who had been missing since Saturday night when he failed to return home from a small dinner party, apparently died of natural causes.

Johnson stumbled and fell on leaving the party. Police said he apparently cut or banged his head, then started hom in a light rain.

"We don't know exactly how it happened but we think he ran his car off the road into a muck of mud and bushes," police said. "He may have staggered from the car and entered what he thought was the driveway of a home."

Johnson played host to Svetlana Alliluyeva, Stalin's daughter, when she first came to the United States to live. Johnson's daughter, a Russian scholar, later translated Mrs. Alliluyeva's first book, "Twenty Letters to a Friend."

In addition to his daughter, Priscilla Johnson MacMillan, he is survived by two sons and another daughter.

Mrs. MacMillan had first met Stalin's daughter in Moscow in 1956 when she was working as a foreign correspondent. She also met Lee Harvey Oswald there and currently is working on a book with Oswald's wife, Marina.
