**Daughter in Soviet Told  
About Mrs. Alliluyeva**

MOSCOW, Jan. 22 (AP)—Svetlana Alliluyeva's daughter expressed surprise at the news that her mother, the daughter of Stalin, has been deprived of Soviet citizenship.

In an interview at the family apartment near the Kremlin, Mrs. Alliluyeva's daughter, Yekaterina, said: "It's the first I heard of it. I did not know about it."

The action has not been reported in the Soviet mass media. It was announced yesterday in the Government gazette of laws and decrees.

Dressed in houserobe, the 20-year-old student smiled politely as she chatted about herself and her brother, Josif, 25. A round-faced girl with dark hair in bangs, she seemed at ease and poised.

"I'm studying physics at a Moscow institute," she said, adding that her brother completed medical school last year, and now works in a clinic.
