March 17, 1967

A second witness at the preliminary hearing, Vernon Bundy, testified that he had seen Clay Shaw in the company of Lee Harvey Oswald at a lake in the New Orleans area in the summer of 1963. In another action, attorney Dean Adams Andrews, Jr., was arrested after a grand jury indicted him for <u>MAMMANNAMMANN</u> perjury.

March 18, 1967

Clay Shaw was ordered to stand trial by the judges at the preliminary hearing.

March 23, 1967

The New Orleans grand jury issued an indictment against Clay Shaw for conspiracy to assassinate President Kennedy.

April 5, 1967

Clay Shaw entered a plea of not guilty. Layton Martens, a former roommate of David Ferrie, was indicted on a charge of perjury by the grand jury.
