The DA said the "phrases used by Novel are almost identical with the phrases used by Gov. Connally with regard to his refusal to cooperate in the extradition of Sergio Arcacha."

"In the last five years," Garrison said, "we have brought back hundreds of defendants and witnesses from other states without any trouble at all in a single instance. Suddenly everything is different, now that there is an independent investigation being conducted into President Kennedy's murder."
