Hanoi Interview SFChronicle AUG 7 1972 Clark's Bombing Report

Hong Kong Ramsey Clark, former United States attorney general who is visiting North Vietnam, said on Hanoi radio yesterday that he had seen a dike, a sluice gate, a leper hospital and a children's school that had been

bombed by American team from the International planes.

An interview Clark gave the Voice of Vietnam, re-porting on his investigations of U.S. bombings, was relayed here yesterday in a broadcast from the North Vietnam capital.

Clark is a member of a

Commission for Enquires into U.S. War Crimes in In-dochina that is now in North Vietnam.

Clark told the Voice of Vietnam that at Vu Dong dike in the Thu district of Thai Binh province he had seen large craters on top of the dikes caused by bomb hits.

He said the bombs has killed a mother and her daughter.

Clark said the hospital and school, seen after they had allegedly been bombed July 31, were in the village of Phu Vang. He said the vil-lage had been attacked twice and 20 bombs dropped.

Clark said three people had been killed and three others injured at the hospital, which cares for 1000 people, and that damage was extensive.
