Haldeman's lawyer, Frank Strickler, commenting on Magruder's book 23 May 74, says that in a telephone conversation (date unspecified; between Jan 73 and 14 Apr 73)** between Magruder and Higby, Magruder denied he could implicate Haldeman (from context, in the Watergate cover-up). LATimes: "That telephone conversation was recorded [apparently by Higby, and there is reference to the recording in the edited White House transcripts of Mr. Nixon's Watergate conversations. In an April 14, 1973, meeting with [Nixon and Haldeman], [Ehrlichman] said of the recording, according to the transcript: 'Higby handled it so well that Magruder has closed all his doors now with this tape.' The President asked: 'What good will that do, John?' Ehrlichman: Sir, it beats the socks off him if he ever gets off the reservation. ""
