Fielding break-in - Lawyer for Ellsberg (?), Lenny Weinglass, says a man named Elmer Davis has been arrested (no date) for break-in at Dr. Fielding's office. Davis claims the Beverly Hills police department tried to coerce him into making a confession and that he was convicted by perjured statements by members of that police department. Weinglass claims the only witness against Davis was apparently a police officer.
