22nd Amendment - "An anonymous group of people who call themselves Citizens for Nixon '76 is proceeding with plans to launch an advertising campaign in July to repeal the 22nd amendment, which bars U.S. presidents from seeking a third term. ... Richard DeLia, who heads Progress for Peace, an advertising agency that is handling the citizens' account, ... says the title of the group may be misleading to some people. The Citizens for Nixon are not really citizens for Nixon but are merely using his name to dramatize the need to repeal the 22nd. ... The [bipartisan] groups is made up of about a dozen people, he said, scattered in many states, who 'at this point wish to remain anonymous.' ... He said the ad agency was founded last December and specialized in 'weaving themes of ecological concern into corporate and consumer advertising.' ... "
