Material from Hunt's WH office - Roy Sheppard is apparently the man referred to by Peter Wolf (see entry under Wolf, 19 Apr 73) who removed eight cartons from White House 18 Jun 72. Sheppard's new lawyer, Ben Cotton, says Sheppard testified to Ervin committee and Watergate grand jury (no dates, but from context testimony before one or the other was given today) that he picked up at WX National Airport eight cartons, from a woman he now believes/- from news photos - Mrs. Hunt.\* Kept cartons at his home in Alexandria; did not open cartons until Nov 72, when he burned them, because no one had asked about them.
