Nixon (jewelry) - This is the date Jack Anderson says (in column 5 Aug 74) he first published item on Nixon jewelry collection, when he said the jewelry was catalogued for Nixon by WX jewelers, Shaw and Dussinger, in "thick books," complete with photos of each piece.

From column of 5 Aug 74: "On the same day our column appeared, Edward O. Sullivan telephoned the jewelers from New York City and spoke to a partner, John Shaw. Sullivan said he was authorized by the Nixon family to pick up the books at once. In a matter of hours, he strode into the store, demanded the records and walked out with them. 'He came right down and picked up the books,' recalled William Dussinger. Neither partner 'has seen or heard from him since.' We have now identified Sullivan as Pat Nixon's cousin. He is also a New York insurance broker who reportedly insures all of the Nixon jewels."
