Ralph Newman - Undated story says Newman "has come under scrutiny" by Jaworski's office.

"[The report of the Joint Committee on Internal Revenue Taxation, made public 3 Apr] indicated that Newman incorrectly said in a sworn statement that he had examined 'Part II' of Nixon's papers in April, 1969, before a July 25, 1969 deadline for claiming tax deductions for such gifts. [He] changed his story for the joint committee staff, acknowledging that he did not even see 'Part II' of the President's documents until November, 1969, and did not get a detailed list of the alleged '1969 gift' until March 27, 1970. ...

"At first, Newman told the joint committee staff, he was contacted in April, 1969, by Frank De Marco.... Later, how-ever, Newman said he never discussed the appraisal assignment with De Marco until October, 1969 - well after the cut-off date for deducting the value of a gift of papers....

"The IRS and the joint committee staff, breezes... apparently agreed that the papers were placed there for storage and no gift was designated or accepted until a year later."
