1971 that may represent a crucial piece of evidence in the
Government's upcoming prosecution of the White House
'plumbers.' [Fielding break-in.*] The transcript, whose
existence was made known by an extremely well-placed source,
is believed to be the only record of a telephone call on
July 7, 1971, in which ... Ehrlichman reportedly requested
C.I.A. assistance for one of the 'plumbers' from ... Cushman

"The reported existence of the shorthand notes [three
typewritten lines], taken by a secretary who is said to have
listened in on the conversation, assumes importance in view
of General Cushman's testimony in August that his
recollection of the caller's identity was based on
circumstantial evidence alone. One C.I.A. official
described [the use of a secretary to take notes of a telephone
conversation] as standard procedure at the agency."
