SFC 7 Jun 74

Kissinger, at first news conference following return from Middle East negotiations, is repeatedly questioned about his part in FBI wiretaps between 1969 and 1971 of members of his National Security Council staff. One of the first questions, apparently, was "whether or not you have consulted with any counsel in preparation for a defense against a possible perjury indictment." Kissinger is angry and after several questions, including several pointed ones from Mollenhoff, refuses to answer any more.
