Nixon (subpoenas) - Chief U.S. Marshal Wayne B. Colburn says in WX that on 28 or 29 Aug Nixon will be served with a defense subpoena requiring his testimony at the Watergate conspiracy trial. Chris Rice, a spokesman for Colburn, says that at the same time Nixon will be served with a civil subpoena requiring him to give a deposition 24 Sep*in Santa Ana. The first subpoena is Ehrlichman's, the second that of 21 plaintiffs who were denied admission to rally on Billy Graham Day, Charlotte, N.C., 15 Oct 71.

Rice says the marshal's service has determined that both criminal and civil subpoenas must be served personally on Nixon, and that this would be done by Gaylord L. Campbell, U.S. marshal in Los Angeles. (Story is unclear on whether Campbell will serve only the criminal subpoena or both; if the civil subpoena is to be served by someone else, this is not clearly indicated and no name is mentioned.)
