W. Clement Stone has three-hour conversation with Nixon (presumably today; UPI says "less than 24 hours before he was pardoned"). The conversation apparently takes place at San Clemente since Stone says he left copies of his books with Nixon. Stone says they did not discuss Nixon's pardon, but talked about Stone's theories on positive mental attitudes (PMA).

The above is from UPI story datelined Chicago, which quotes statements made by Stone "Sunday night" (8 Sep). Stone says Nixon was in a "serious frame of mind," but not despondent. "These reports that he is in ill health are a figment of somebody's imagination. He was thinking very clearly. He was able to launch a joke. The man's in excellent health."

Jerry Clark, Key Biscayne realtor, says of the house in question that he has been authorized to put the house and lot on the market. It is owned by a trust fund group set up under Edward Campbell, with Edwin H. Underwood, a lawyer, listed as the owner of record. No details on Campbell or Underwood.
