From story: "The nature of the material [on Fonda] in the FBI ... file strongly suggest that the Huston Plan for domestic intelligence - proposed in 1970 by then White House aide Tom Huston and personally approved by Nixon in July 1970 but allegedly rescinded 5 days later - was never fully halted but rather was in many respects implemented."
