Ziegler - Boston University's School of Public Communication withdraws its invitation; student government decides by 14-to-5 vote to cancel his lecture on "The Use and Abuse of Power," after strong faculty and student protests over paying Ziegler's \$3,000 fee. "Printed signs saying 'Declare Ziegler Inoperative' [have been] displayed at the school." See also entry 30 Jan 75.

Student opinion had originally favored Ziegler's appearance and apparently was influenced by the dean's argument that it would be "wrong" to help Ziegler "or anyone else get rich because of their association with the Watergate cover-up."
