Nixon ("JFK's Opinion of Nixon") - Story on book soon to be published by Benjamin Bradlee, title not given; book is on John Kennedy. Excerpts from book were released today.

"Bradlee recalled that at the end of 1962, after Mr. Nixon had been defeated in an attempt to become governor of California, Kennedy said he thought Mr. Nixon was unsound mentally, or, as he once said of him, 'sick, sick, sick.' Referring to Mr. Nixon's remark to reporters after his defeat that 'You won't have Nixon to kick around any more,' Kennedy said, 'nobody could talk like that and be normal.'"

Another quotation has Kennedy saying of Nixon, "I can't stand the way he puts everything in Tricia's mouth. It makes me sick. He's a cheap bastard; that's all there is to it."

Vesco (IOS suit) - In Newark, N.J., Vesco lawyer (unnamed) informs Superior Court Judge Melvin P. Antell that Vesco has ordered his attorneys to drop their defense of a \$5.5 million lawsuit which charges him with defrauding stockholders of International Overseas Services Lt. in 1970 and 1971. Vesco resigned as chairman if IOS in 1972, the year he was charged by the SEC of looting IOS of \$224 million. Story does not say if the present suit is one brought by the SEC, or perhaps by stockholders.
