Watergate break-in - "In an interview published last summer ... Frank Sturgis ... reported that one of the purposes of the Watergate break-in was to find a secret memorandum from the Castro government to the Democratic platform committee, listing all the covert CIA and related operations launched against Cuba since 1965 or 66. Sturgis claims that the FBI and CIA had discovered excerpts and references to the confidential memo, which was supposed to be more than 130 page typewritten pages. According to Sturgis, 'the Castro government suspected the CIA did not tell the whole truth about these operations, even to American political leaders. Therefore the Cubans were providing an itemized list of all The complaints were especially bitter about such abuses. various attempts made to assassinate the Castro brothers." "Sturgis ... charged that [Hunt] had become the laughing stock of the Miami Cuban community for failing in a mission to assassinate Castro But Sturgis also credited Hunt with carrying out what he called some successful 'disposals' for

the CIA."
