Sturgis - See column by Jack Anderson and Les Whitten on testimony by Sturgis before the Rockefeller Commission; no date is given for his appearance.

"The chief exhibit is a picture of two vagrants, resembling Sturgis and Hunt, who were picked up in Dallas after the assassination. Upon close examination, the picture of the man who is supposed to be Sturgis does not resemble him in some important details. The relative height of the two men in the picture also doesn't correspond to the actual height of Sturgis and Hunt."

Column says Sturgis was questioned for two days by commission's senior counsel, Robert Olsen, and denied that he was in Dallas the day of the JFK assassination, the day before or the day after. "Sturgis described assassination plots in Cuba, the Dominican Republic, Guatemala, Haiti and Panama. He had participated in the plotting against leaders, both high and low, in all these countries, he testified. The conspirators included persons he knew to be connected with the CIA, he said. His own role had been limited to helping 'set up' assassination attempts. He had never taken part in any actual murders, he swore."
