Nixon, taxes (IRS) - Philadelphia Sunday Bulletin says today that IRS removed information on Nixon's tax returns from microfilm indexes (UPI:) "when evidence was disclosed in late 1973 that he had underpaid his taxes." AP (WXP) says Nixon paid less than \$1,000 in income taxes in 1970 and 1971. Bulletin story quotes a former IRS auditor, Ralph F. Lacross, and "other I.R.S. sources."

From UPI report on Bulletin story: "Mr. Lacross said he had participated in a process of 'burning off' Mr. Nixon's name from microfilmed indexes, making it impossible for anyone within the I.R.S. to locate his tax returns. He said the order from Washington to 'burn off' Mr. Nixon's name from the indexes was unprecedented, but the command was followed in the agency's Mid-Atlantic regional headquarters The Bulletin guoted in Philadelphia without hesitation. Mr. Lacross ... and 'other I.R.S. sources' as saying that Mr. Nixon's name was also removed from indexes in Martinsburg, W. Va., where the tax agency's national computer center is based." Francis Geibel, at the time IRS chief of internal security, confirms tonight that the information was removed from the indexes, but denies it was done as a cover-up for Nixon.

LaCross retired last June on a medical disability; Geibel retired in December.
