Silbert - See entry 20 May. Seymour Glanzer\* apparently also was questioned 20 May at Senate Judiciary Committee hearing on Silbert's confirmation.

At that hearing Glanzer said that after the tape of Baldwin's original intv by the LATimes 28 Sep 72 was given to the court, he listened to it in the presence of Baldwin and Charles Morgan Jr., who represented the Association of Democratic Chairmen, the target of the Watergate phone tap; that Baldwin said then he had made a mistake in the intv in saying "CIA" instead of "CRP"; and that he (Glanzer) had informed Judge Sirica that the transcript, prepared by a court reporter, should be changed to reflect this.

Baldwin, in a telephone intv today by the LATimes, denies categorically ever having made the statements attributed to him by Glanzer, and insists that in the original interview he used, and meant to use, the initials "CIA." He is supported in this by Morgan and by his lawyer, Robert Mirto.

Silbert and Glanzer apparently learned later they had misinformed Sirica (neither WXP nor NYT gives the circumstances); both tell Judiciary Committee they cannot "recall" having told Sirica they had misinformed him.

Rose Mary Woods - Undated item. "According to her friends Rose Mary Woods, the secretary first hired by Richard M. Nixon in 1951, has been left bitter, humiliated and angry by her moves from the White House to his 'hide-away' in the Executive Office Building and now to the small Lafayette Square house allotted for the terminal business of former Presidents.

"Although Miss Woods grants no interviews, a report in the current McCall's magazine says she kept Mr. Nixon's 'hide-away' office like a shrine until most of the contents were crated in February. Friends say she is 'rancorous' about 'the treatment she and Nixon are getting from the Ford people.'"
