Nixon's first law office - The Nixon Law Foundation, Inc., established in Apr 72 to buy Nixon's first law office and make it an historical landmark, now wants to sell it. It has been offered to the La Habra Chamber of Commerce, which now occupies the front of the building. The foundation had tried for two years, without success, to have the California State Landmark Advisory Committee designate the building as an official historical site.

George Rochester, president of the foundation, says that the Watergate scandals and Nixon's resignation dried up contributions "so we have to sell. We just don't have the money to keep it up and finish paying for it."

Mitchell asks Supreme Court not to act on his disbarment until final action is taken on his appeals from his Watergate conviction, saying, "it seems certain" that the court's order 31 Mar suspending him was based on the jury's verdict. Supreme Court sources say the suspension did not stem from the jury verdict but from a routine notice from the U.S. District Court for the District of Columbia that he had been suspended there.

Story says that when the Supreme Court suspended Mitchell 31 Mar it gave him 40 days to say why he should not be disbarred. If the 40 days is taken to mean working days, and excluding holidays (Memorial Day, 26 May), that period would have ended 27 May.
