Lt. Col. Jack Brennan says he is retiring from the Marine Corps to become the head of Nixon's office staff. Story is datelined San Clemente; the announcement presumably is made at Nixon's office.

Brennan was Nixon's military aide from the time of his first term in office and accompanied him on trips to 41 countries, including the trip to China. He is now, officially, attached to the operations and training division at Camp Pendleton, but has spent most of his time at San Clemente since Nixon's resignation.

"Brennan said he will retire from [the Marine Corps] July 31. He previously had been scheduled to go to the Naval War College in Newport, R.I., one of the most important steps in a marine officer's career."
