Nixon Aide Fired Over Demo Raid

WASHINGTON — (AP) — President Nixon's campaign organization has fired a lawyer who refused to answer questions by Federal Bureau of Investigation agents in connection with a break-in at Democratic National Headquarters.

G. Gordon Liddy, an attorney for the finance division of the Committee for the Re-Election of the President, was fired June 28, De Van L. Shumway, director of public affairs, said yesterday.

The reason for the firing, Shumway said, was "because he elected not to respond to certain questions by FBI agents in relation to the incident at Democratic National Headquarters."

"It is our policy that all employees cooperate fully with appropriate law enforcement officials in the conduct of this investigation," Shumway added.

Five men with bugging equipment were arrested May 15 in the headquarters of the Democratic National Committee.
