GOP Cash and Demo Bugging Case

WASHINGTON — (UPI) — At least \$114,000 passed through the Committee to Re-elect the President into the account of a suspect in the bugging of the Democratic National Committee offices, the Washington Star-News said today.

Four deposits amounting to \$89,000 were placed in the account of Bernard Barker, a Miami real estate man, in the name of a prominent Mexican business lawyer, the newspaper reported.

The lawyer, Manuel De-guerre Ogarrío, denied any knowledge of the transaction, the Star-News said.

Last week the Washington Post disclosed that a \$25,000 campaign check from Kenneth H. Dahlberg, President Nixon's chief fund raiser in the Middle West, was traced to Barker's Miami bank account.

Police said Barker was one of five men arrested with electronic gear inside the Democratic committee offices at the Watergate

complex nearly two months ago.

The Star-News reported the sources, described as close to the investigation, said that apparently money given as legitimate campaign contributions was used to finance the break-in.

The newspaper also said the Republicans had established a special "security fund" to thwart demonstrations at their Miami Beach convention.
