..... [There are] four principal fund-raising groups - the Finance Committee for the Re-election of the President and three other committees to pay radio, television and printed advertising costs'.....

..... Contributions made before the April 7 effective date of the new [Federal Election Campaign Act] did not have to be disclosed, and by actively soliciting early anonymous gifts the Nixon finance committees are believed to have received more than \$10-million without the disclosure now required by law.

.....The Nixon finance organization also includes 50 separate state fund-raising committees .....

..... As the General Accounting Office interprets the law, the 40 state finance committees that did not file pre-convention statements were not required to file them, and those filing [10 state committees filed disclosure statements this week] probably need not have done so. G.A.O. officials said that pre-convention financial disclosures were required only of state committees that made actual expenditures for the Republicans' National Convention, which opens in Miami Beach [21 August].
