- [There are] four principal fund-raising groups the Finance Committee for the Re-election of the President
 and three other committees to pay radio, television and
 printed advertising costs
- Contributions made before the April 7 effective date of the new [Federal Election Campaign Act] did not have to be disclosed, and by actively soliciting early anonymous gifts the Nixon finance committees are believed to have received more than \$10-million without the disclosure now required by law.
-The Nixon finance organization also includes 50 separate state fund-raising committees
- As the General Accounting Office interprets the law, the 40 state finance committees that did not file preconvention statements were not required to file them, and those filing [10 state committees filed disclosure statements this week] probably need not have done so. G.A.O. officials said that preconvention financial disclosures were required only of state committees that made actual expenditures for the Republicans' National Convention, which opens in Miami Beach [21 August].
