

Dole Claims More Demo Violations

WASHINGTON — (AP) — Republican National Chairman Robert J. Dole says he has found seven more violations of political finance laws by Sen. George McGovern's presidential campaign.

Sen. Dole (R-Kan.) last week alleged several other violations by the Democrats, and yesterday said, "These further apparent violations confirm my belief that McGovern is playing fast and loose with the election laws and deceiving the American public . . ."

'Contemptible'

But McGovern's national political director, Frank Mankiewicz, replied that Dole's accusations were "contemptible and totally lacking in substance."

President Nixon's campaign finances already are under investigation after the

General Accounting Office declared on Aug. 26 that there were "apparent and possible" violations involving GOP campaign funds.

The GAO also is looking into McGovern campaign finances.

Dole said one apparent violation is a contribution of at least \$50,000 by Playboy magazine publisher Hugh Hefner, which, Dole said, was divided into several \$2500 individual contributions so Hefner could avoid payment of federal taxes.

Press Reports

Dole also said press reports have cited contributions of \$350,000 from Los Angeles businessman Max Palevsky. Dole said only \$102,000 from Palevsky has been reported in McGovern's public campaign records.
