## Lawyer Asks Courts to Name Prosecutor in Watergate Case

WASHINGTON, Sept. 18 Charging the Democrats with hypocrisy and the Republicans with bias, a Washington lawyer filed a series of legal motions today to have the Federal courts appoint a special prosecutor to investigate the alleged attempt at bugging the Demo-cratic national headquarters in the Watergate complex on June 17.
John F. Banzhaf 3d, an out-

spoken consumer advocate and law professor at George Wash-ington University, said that he was "shocked" at the Democrats for calling repeatedly in public for a special impartial prosecutor to handle the investigation while doing nothing in private to see that such a prosecutor is appointed.
