PARTY HEADS DEBATE WATERGATE IMPACT

WASHINGTON, Sept. 24 (AP) —The Democrats have failed -The Democrats have failed to make a public-gripping issue of the Watergate affair, Sen-ator Robert J. Dole of Kansas said today, but Lawrence F. O'Brien predicted that plenty of activity on Capitol Hill would keep alive the alleged political espionage aimed at Democratic headouarters. headquarters.

headquarters. Senator Dole, chairman of the Republican National Committee, and Mr. O'Brien, campaign di-rector for the Democratic Presi-dential candidate, Senator George McGovern, agreed, but only to a degree, that Mr. Mc-Govern would improve his pres-ent standing in the polls—as much as 34 points behind Presi-dent Nixon. dent Nixon.

dent Nixon. Mr. O'Brien predicted "a very close election, like 1960 or 1968." But Senator Dole would only say that he expected "some slippage," not enough to threaten Mr. Nixon's lead. Mr. Dole and Mr. O'Brien confronted each other on the television-radio program "Issues and Answers" on the American Broadcasting Company network.
