Nixon Trio Ordered To Watergate Trial

MIAMI — (UPI) — Three of President Nixon's top money men — Maurice Stans, Kenneth Dahlberg and Hugh Sloan — were ordered yesterday to appear in the trial of Bernard L. Barker, one of the "Watergate five."

Criminal Court Judge Paul Baker signed extradition papers for the three Republicans, ordering them to appear as material witnesses in the Oct. 30 trial of Barker, a 55-year-old Cuban-born Miamian accused of misusing his notary public seal on a \$25,000 check.

Barker and four other men were arrested last June

in connection with the break-in at the Democratic National Headquarters in the Watergate apartment complex in Washington.

The extradition orders noted that the appearance of the three, all past or present officers in the Committee to Re-elect the President, could "not be secured voluntarily."

Stans lives in Washington, Sloan in nearby McLean, Va., and Dahlberg in Wayzata, Minn.; courts in those jurisdictions must rule on the extradition order if the three men refuse to comply voluntarily.
