

Conservative Asks Investigation Of Bogus Campaign Literature

A Conservative party candidate for the House of Representatives from Brooklyn's 15th Congressional District said yesterday that he had asked the Federal Bureau of Investigation and the police to investigate "some dirty pool" that he said has marred his battle for election.

The candidate, Franklin C. Jones, told the police that someone had made and distributed throughout the district a close copy of one of his fliers, with one addition - the picture of a black man over the words: "Elect Franklin C. Jones Your Congressman."

"A real cheap shot," Mr. Jones told an interviewer. "Let's face it—this is Bay Ridge and people call it lily white. It's an attempt to discredit me and make it appear that a col-Bay Ridge."

Mr. Jones is white. He esti-mated that thousands of the bogus fliers had been distributed across the district, which covers Bay Ridge, Bensonhurst and Park Slope and parts of Borough Park and Red Hook.

Most of the fliers were distributed in Bay Ridge, where Mr. Jones lives and where he is a Conservative party district leader.
