Under the law governing extradition orders, a judge "has to determine if the witness is material and necessary, that it will not cause undue hardship to the witness to attend and testify."

In a short news conference before entering the courtroom, Mr. Stans said that the move to extradite him to testify in the trial of Mr. Barker, which is to begin Oct. 30, was "nothing but political sabotage on behalf of the McGovern forces."

## **Explains His Role**

The case against Mr. Barker is being brought by Richard E. Gerstein, the state attorney of Miami, who is a Democrat. Mr. Barker is charged with "false and fraudulent use" of a notary public seal on a \$25,000 check that was earlier handled by the Finance Committe to reelect the President.
