A judge in Detroit turned down a request by two University of Michigan graduate students to have the Presidential elections in Michigan stopped until the details of the alleged political espionage at the Watergate were made public and the charges were settled.

The suit filed by the two students asserted that unless the political espionage charges against the Republican party were settled they couldn't make an intelligent vote.

U.S. Judge Cornelia Kennedy denied the request, saying that the students were "alleging political sabotage has prevented the Democratic party from presenting its party platform, and apparently claiming this lack of information precludes the possibility of a reasonable voter making a rational choice."
