Watergate figure's wife jet

Chicago firemen sifting through the rubble of the United Air Lines crash Saturday found more than \$10,000 in the purse of Mrs. F. Howard Hunt, a passenger whose husband has been indicted in the break-in at Democratic National Headquarters in Washington.

Chicago Lawn District police Sgt. Leo Clark said the purse contained \$10,587 in cash, in-

cluding one hundred \$100 bills. All identification in the purse belonged to Mrs. Hunt, who died in the crash. Mrs. Hunt, 52, of Potomac, Md., was flying to Chicago to visit cousin, Harold C. Caspary, of Flossmoor.

Her husband was a former CIA official and consultant for the Nixon administration. He was indicted Sept. 29 by a federal grand jury on charges of con-

spiracy to break into Demo- cratic headquarters, obtain sur- veillance and intercept and dis- seminate telephone commu- nications and for possession of eavesdropping equipment.
